September Meeting



We had two speakers at our September meeting. The first was Joel Diamond (left) who spoke to us about the progress of the Mifflin County School District Stadium Project. To date, 4.2 million dollars have been raised through private funds, which is approaching the 4.5 million dollar goal. The stadium committee is hoping to raise \$200,000 through community donations. Currently they are 1/3 of the way towards the goal. Two ways the community can help are through a "Buy a Brick" program at \$200 a brick for the first 1000 bricks. The bricks can be inscribed with up to 3 lines with 18 characters per line; and a "\$1000 Club"-a one-time gift that will have a name, chosen by the donor, etched on a 6 inch by 3 inch bronze plaque on a donor board.

Our second speaker was Ashlie Crosson, PA Teacher of the Year, who teaches at MCHS. Ashlie thanked Mifflin County teachers and staff for helping her become successful by their examples throughout her elementary and high school years. She stated that she considered the award as actually an award for the whole of Mifflin County, its educators and staff in the school system. A question and answer period followed in which she explained the process of selecting the Teacher of the Year and shared information about her responsibilities during her 2-year term. Ashlie is now eligible to compete for the National Teacher of the Year Award.

Representative Kerry Benninghoff was the speaker at the October meeting. He has been a representative since 1996 and is the minority chair of PennDOT. He shared that PA has 44,000 miles of roads and 24,000-25,000 bridges and that the majority of the funds for up keep and repair of these comes from the liquid fuels tax. This revenue is dropping because of the use of TVs and mass transportation so there is less available to be used for road repair. A question and answer period followed the representatives's sharing of information.

At the November meeting a Memorial Service was held to remember the members we have lost the past year.
